Simwatachela Sustainable Agricultural and Arts Program (SSAAP) is a food, nutrition, water and education sustainability organization created by the people and committed to serving the needs of the people.

SSAAP is a 501(c)3 organization. All donations are tax-exempt.

SSAAP promotes upgrading the quality of life in rural areas of Sierra Leone, West Africa; Zambia, Southern Africa; and Ethiopia, East Africa; through drinking cleaner water, sustainable solutions to hunger such as animal-rearing and food production through raising animals, and eliminating food scarcity through produce gardens for Farmers' Associations and Women's Clubs. SSAAP has a micro-loan program in Zambia which assists individuals, groups, and clubs to create their own businesses which in-turn generates revenue in which to begin larger-scale projects. In Sierra Leone, SSAAP works with many animal-rearing projects: chickens, goats, sheep, ducks, pigs, and fish. In Zambia, SSAAP works with chickens, goats and cattle-rearing, specifically. School sponsorship programs exist for vulnerable children to allow children in Zambia to attend primary school (grades 1–7) and children in Sierra Leone to attend primary school (grades 1–6) as well hosts a program for teenage mothers to return to secondary school after giving birth. SSAAP also works with Female Reproductive Health for teenage girls in Sierra Leone and Sanitation and Hygiene Education for adult learners. Our mission involves aiding the most vulnerable and destitute members of the societies where we work, specifically working to empower people in the remote areas by reminding them of their inherent strength, intelligence, beauty and resourcefulness. We believe that through Love of Africa and Africans, deep healing will take place which slowly has the power to eradicate the seed of widespread poverty: hopelessness.
